Music Streaming Drives Success for Rap, Reggaeton Artists Dominating U.S. Streaming Platforms' End-of-Year "Top 2020" Lists

Roddy Ricch, Lil Baby, Bad Bunny, and Megan Thee Stallion Among Artists Who Dominated 2020 As Streaming Drives Music Industry Forward

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Breakout rap and reggaeton artists cemented their place at the top of the streaming music charts in 2020 and continue to dominate year-end "most streamed" and "best of 2020" lists, according to a new analysis by the Digital Media Association. The review of year-end data and charts from DiMA's member companies — Amazon, Apple Music, Pandora, Spotify, and YouTube — found that artists Roddy Ricch, Lil Baby, Bad Bunny, and Megan Thee Stallion were among those with the highest numbers amid the streaming revolution in the music industry. Notably, all four artists have rapidly reached mainstream fame within the past three years.

Additional findings from the review of the year-end lists of DiMA member organizations include:

- Music fans continued their full-throated embrace of streaming in 2020, connecting with top artists such as BTS, Drake, J Balvin, and Cardi B across a range of platforms as streaming allowed consumers to access and engage with the music they love despite social distancing guidelines.
- In a continuing trend since 2019, major rap and reggaeton artists benefit from streaming
 platforms' ability to expand their reach across genres and connect with a broader range
 of fans who are discovering their songs via increasingly curated playlist and discovery
 features.
- Songs such as The Weeknd's "Blinding Lights," Roddy Ricch's "The Box" and Tones & I's "Dance Monkey" were among the tracks that appeared on multiple "Most Streamed Songs" lists from the major streaming platforms.

"The superpowers of music streaming continued to drive music from both new and familiar artists forward in 2020," said Garrett Levin, CEO of the Digital Media Association. "This year, while the world of live music faced unprecedented challenges, we again saw growth in the number of fans eager to engage with the creators they love and discover new artists via streaming, while the quality and quantity of music available to consumers is growing every day. Led by breakout stars such as Roddy Ricch, Bad Bunny, and Megan Thee Stallion, artists and their fans continue to enjoy the benefits of the streaming revolution across the music industry."
