DiMA Statement on Appointment of Shira Perlmutter as Register of Copyrights

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Sept. 21, 2020) — Garrett Levin, President and CEO of DiMA, released the following statement today on the Librarian of Congress' appointment of Shira Perlmutter as the next Register of Copyrights:

"I congratulate Shira Perlmutter on her appointment to be the next Register of Copyrights. Shira's deep knowledge of copyright law, wide-ranging experience on every meaningful copyright policy issue of the last few decades, and practical experience in both the public and private sector make her a natural fit for the position. In particular, Shira's understanding of music licensing issues and the digital economy comes at a critical time and will be invaluable as the Copyright Office continues its vital work to implement the Music Modernization Act. The staff of the Office has been diligent and thorough in their work on that issue to date, and I look forward to working with Shira and to continued strong leadership at the Office.

Additionally, I commend Dr. Hayden for the thorough process she employed in the search for the next Register, in particular the opportunities she provided for public input."

DiMA previously filed comments with the Library of Congress regarding qualifications for the next Register, as part of the Library's public input process.
